President's Message June 2025

In my last President's Message, I reflected on how encompassing tools and shops can become. It was logical that as I progressed in the craft, I was enticed to acquire an overa-



bundance of wonderful stuff. Concurrent with this journey, another unanticipated collection was growing: Turned projects. It didn't take long for my shop and much of our house to become filled with all manner of turned objects.

The collection started with my first almost-bowl. It was a badly chewed up piece of cherry, half the size it started out to be, with an interior that I annihilated with an uphill-presented scraper. It was nevertheless, the first one, and earned a spot on a shelf in the shop (still there.) More bowls followed, bigger, fancier, better designed and executed, and they began to accumulate. The collection grew exponentially as I saved both my successes and the failures. I kept the mishaps and otherwise ruined pieces as practical references and nostalgic connections to an often-challenging process.

As time went on, I started experimenting with unfamiliar projects. I tried ornaments, goblets, inside-out and multi axis turning, and hollowing, to name just a few. The resulting pieces, both successes and failures continued to piled up.

Turning for me was a solitary activity. I would get lost in the Zen of emersion in the process, and the Zen of being surrounded by pieces I had imprinted with something intensely personal. And again, the result was that I threw nothing away, and the stacks grew.

Throughout all this I was starting to discover there were wonderful things I could do with this evergrowing inventory. As we all know, perhaps the best thing a turner can do with his or her pieces is to gift them away. Christmas and birthday presents, as a "thank you," or just for no reason, the excitement over a turned gift is magical. Such a piece is an expression of the love that goes into making it. I have spent weeks crafting a keepsake box for my wife, hoping it will be living room worthy...and have given a quickly turned pen to the guy that fixed our boiler.

Of course, the next progression of gift giving is charity. I would like this to play a more major role in my turning. Programs like Beads of Courage, Empty Bowls, and wig stand charities speak to the best of what we do, actually helping to make someone's life better though our craft.

Having an inventory of turned pieces also suggests sales. I must admit that I have had little success selling my stuff. The few sales I have made were gratifying because it meant that someone thought enough of my work to actually spend money on it. However, for me the monetary reward never seemed equal to my effort. Some of our members have been quite successful in selling their work. I believe that this involves (1) creating skillfully made and beautiful pieces, (2) developing an efficient process to expedite their production, and (3) a personal ability to sell. (It is impressive to watch Mark Durrenberger, Steve Ball, Reid Gilmore, and others when they engage with customers at fairs and events.

I fear my shop will remain an archaeological dig with layers of work extending back over the years. New work will come and go but the residue will remain my historic record.

1. President's Report - Greg Carell

- Signage: Beth recommended placing a sign on the 1870's House door for May's canceled meeting in case any new members or visitors try to attend.

- Safety Minute (by Tony Blanco): PPE maintenance is critical. You need protection from the harmful particles that are less than 10 microns. Tested various masks (N95, RZ, etc.) You should periodically clean filters and the mask exterior. Always use a face shield when turning and replace it when needed."Take care of the things that take care of you."
- Charity: Sophia was not present at this meeting. Greg stressed that there is a continued need for participation; further status updates are pending.

- Bruce Mellor: Reminded members that when sending out club-wide emails via the website that they should include their name and email address so everyone knows who sent it out.


5. Demonstration Mike Suter
